Dear Parents/Carers,

The beginning of the year is always an exciting time, with new children, new displays and new learning planned in the classes. All of the staff have been busy over the holidays creating enabling environments to engage and enhance the children's learning.

It has been wonderful to have the children back in school and the learning buzz in the classroom has been impressive. We have started the year with a whole school focus on 'The Lost Words' focusing on the language used and the art work within the text. This has also allowed us to think about the world around us and what we share it with.

The outdoor environment continues to develop with new areas uncovered, to make the playground a more exciting place for the children. Inside the school has also seen changes, with new windows and doors fitted to improve our energy efficiency.

One of our changes this year is that the children in year 3-6 will be asked to complete some weekly homework activities, to support their learning in spellings, reading and basic mathematical fluency. This homework is not compulsory, but will give the children more strategies to facilitate their learning and extend what they are already doing in class. # What's happening in school?

## **Forest School**

On Friday 6<sup>th</sup> September, all of the children from year 1-6 visited the Forest as part of our 'Lost Words' learning.

The children worked in mixed groups taking part in 5 different activities:

- Sound scapes
- What animals live here?
- Tree identification
- Shelters
- Free time.

The children had a fabulous time exploring the woods, considering how different animals can use it and the different species within it. This supports the children's scientific understanding of animals and their habitats, showing them what this looks like during the autumn months in a wooded environment.

The forest also helps the children to develop resilience and independence, creating shelters with minimal materials so that they can use problem solving skills, in context. Also, how they can work together, as part of a team, to create something that will benefit all of them.

Finally, the forest is fun! The children get the chance to climb trees, play in the mud and spend time together (all properly risk assessed of course).

#### Safeguarding at Slindon

#### What is safeguarding?

Visitors coming on to school premises, including the playground, have a duty of care towards the welfare and safety of the children and adults in the school. This is called safeguarding.
