



Art Knowledge Organiser: Self Portraits

Key Vocabulary

abstract	Art that does not attempt to represent reality. Using shapes, colours, and texture to represent objects.
artist	A person who creates paintings or drawings as a profession or hobby.
collage	A piece of art made by sticking various different materials such as photographs and pieces of paper or fabric on to a backing.
cubism	A way of painting and drawing where artists show more than one view of something in the same picture, like looking at many sides of a cube at once.
emotions	Examples: happy, sad, scared, nervous, excited, angry.
expressionism	A style of painting, music, or drama in which the artist or writer seeks to express the inner world of emotion.
facial features	Examples include; eyes, nose, mouth, ears and hair.
line	Examples: straight, curve, long short, bold, faint, sharp, thin, thick, blunt, pressure
Modern Art	Art of a style marked by a significant departure from traditional styles and values, in particular that created between the late 19th and the late 20th centuries
Pop Art	An art movement that began in America in the 1950s. Art inspired by popular culture. This included pop stars and everyday objects like tins of soup.
portrait	A piece of work showing a person.
profile	A representation of something in outline especially : a human head or face represented or seen in a side view
realistic	To represent things in a way that is accurate and true to life.
self-portrait	A portrait that an artist creates of themselves.
surrealism	A 20th-century movement in art and literature which sought to release the creative potential of the unconscious mind, for example by the irrational juxtaposition of images.
symmetry	Images and objects made up of exactly similar parts facing each other

Born: 6 August 1928, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, United States.



