**Iceberg**: A large piece of ice floating in the ocean.


**Rescue**: To save someone from a dangerous or harmful situation.

**Maiden Voyage**: The first voyage of a ship after it is commissioned.

## <u>Titanic – Year 3/4 History</u>

### **Key Knowledge**

- 1. The Titanic was considered unsinkable but tragically sank on its maiden voyage.
- 2. The iceberg that Titanic hit tore holes in the ship's hull, causing it to sink.
- 3. Only 705 out of 2208 passengers and crew survived the disaster, primarily due to a lack of lifeboats.
- 4. The Titanic was equipped with luxurious amenities, including a swimming pool, gym, and library for passengers.
- 5. Women and children were prioritised during the evacuation of the Titanic.



# Timeline of Important Events 1912

- April 10th: Titanic sets sail from Southampton on its maiden voyage.
- April 14th: Titanic hits an iceberg at 11:40 pm.
- April 15th: Titanic sinks at 2:20 am.
- April 18th: Carpathia rescues the survivors.
