

24th March 1603 May 1604 **Timeline of Events** King James I becomes King of England. The group begin to plot against King James I. 13th April 1570 March 1605 5th November 1605 Guy Fawkes is born. The plotters rent a cellar under the Guu Fawkes is found in the cellar Houses of Parliament. with 36 barrels of gunpowder by the king's guards. 26th October 1605 Lord Monteagle, who is a Catholic, receives an unsigned letter that warns 31st January 1606 him not to go to the opening of Parliament on the 5th November. Guy Fawkes is executed.
