What's happening in school?

Chestnuts

Whilst Chestnut Class were really looking forward to their residential at the start of this term, they would all agree that the highlight so far, since returning to school after the Easter holiday, was their morning with CYE.

As we couldn't go to CYE, CYE came to us and entertained the children with a morning of team-building exercises. The children used planks and tyres to cross the swamp safely; completed an egg-drop challenge; practiced their archery skills and tackled a word game without words!





Catkins

Catkin's Class topic for this half term is 'A Ticket to Ride'. Our focus for the first two weeks back has been space travel. We have been sharing the class text 'The Way Back Home' by Oliver Jeffers. We have explored our class space station, built rockets, learnt the name of the eight planets in the solar system and enjoyed malleable experiences including alien slime, moon sand and galaxy water play. We have also taken inspiration from the work of Jackson Pollock and Peter Thorpe to begin to create our own space artwork.

Number facts

Number facts are simple calculations with two numbers. They could be addition, subtraction, multiplication or division. Sometimes these can be called fact families. Number bonds (like 3 + 7 = 10, or 9 - 4 = 5) or facts learned from times tables (like $4 \times 6 = 24$ or $27 \div 3 = 9$) are number facts.

Prepositions

Prepositions are words which link nouns, pronouns and phrases to other words in a sentence

Prepositions often describe the position of something, the time when something happens or the way in which something is done. The prepositions "of", "to" and "for" have other functions.



Thought-full Workshops

Further to our letter about the Thought-full workshops for parents, here is a breakdown of each workshop. You do not need to attend them all and there will be opportunities for questions.

Session	Date	Theme
Session 2	30 th April	This session is one of two which focuses on supporting children with anxiety and worries. It explores what keeps anxiety going and the strategies that can be used to support children.
Session 3	7 th May	This is the second session on supporting children with anxiety and worries. There will be further discussion of approaches to support an anxious child including use of language and the PACE approach (playfulness, acceptance, curiosity and empathy), including some ideas about how parents can incorporate these areas into their daily life.
Session 4	14 th May	In this session we introduce emotion coaching which is a step-by-step approach in helping children to learn about emotions and how to deal with them.
Session 5	21 st May	In the final session we look at encouraging resilience. We explore how we can support anxious children to build their resilience and grow into adults who can cope with life's ups and downs. We bring the session to a close by reflecting on the workshops and next steps.

Safeguarding at Slindon

What is safeguarding?

Visitors coming on to school premises, including the playground, have a duty of care towards the welfare and safety of the children and adults in the school. This is called safeguarding.

Safeguarding means that:

- children are protected from maltreatment
- a child's health or development is protected
- children grow up with safe and effective care
- action is taken to ensure the best outcomes for all children

Safeguarding is the action we take to promote the welfare of children in our care to protect them from harm. We take this responsibility very seriously and we work in close partnership with parents and professionals to protect all of our children. The school will take any reasonable action to ensure the welfare and safety of its pupils is maintained.

Our staff and governors have been trained on safeguarding in line with the KEEPING CHILDREN SAFE IN EDUCATION document and have taken part in 'PREVENT'.
