| Abstract art | Relating to or representing art that does not attempt to <br> represent reality, but achieves its effect using shapes, <br> colours, and textures. |
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| Artist | A person who creates paintings or drawings as a <br> profession or hobby. |
| Geometric shape | Geometric shapes are mathematical shapes, e.g. A <br> triangle or square |
| Mix | Combine or put together |
| Primary colours | The three primary colours are typically red, green and <br> blue |
| Secondary <br> colours | A secondary colour is a colour made by mixing of two <br> primary colours. These are Orange, Green, Violet |
| Shade | A colour, especially with regard to how light or dark it <br> is |
| Tertiary colour | Six Tertiary Colours (Ts): Red-Orange, Yellow-Orange, <br> Yellow-Green, Blue-Green, Blue-Violet, Red-Violet, <br> which are formed by mixing a primary with a <br> secondary. |
| Tint | A colour or a variety of a colour; |
