

electric cars	Electric cars use electricity to make the motor turn.
motor	A motor turns energy into movement so that things (such
	as cars and trains) can move.
petrol	Petrol is the fuel used in petrol engines to make cars
	move.
railway	A railway is the track that trains run on.
steam engine	A steam engine uses steam from boiling water to make
	it move. The steam pushes the moving parts
transport	Carrying people or goods from one place to another.
travel	Moving from one place to another.




Knowledge Outcomes:
